Summary

David Trickey is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist, chartered by the British Psychological Society and registered with the Health & Care Professions Council. He has extensive clinical experience working with children and families and has specialised in trauma and traumatic bereavement since 2000. He has successfully managed various services and is a BPS Registered Supervisor. He has undertaken further training in assessments of parenting, assessments of attachment, Family Therapy, Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR) and clinical supervision. In addition to direct work with children and families, he consults to and supervises other professionals, provides training for various professional groups, has presented at international conferences including a number of keynote addresses and supervises doctoral research. He acts as an expert advisor to police and as an expert witness approximately 20 times per year in civil and criminal cases, particularly in the areas of trauma, bereavement and child testimony.
