Summary

David Trickey is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist, chartered by the British Psychological Society and registered with the Health & Care Professions Council. He has extensive clinical experience working with children and families and has specialised in working with trauma and traumatic bereavement since 2000. He has successfully managed a child psychology service and has undertaken further training in assessments of parenting, assessments of attachment, Family Therapy and Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR). In addition to direct work with children and families, he offers consultation and supervision to other professionals, provides teaching and training for various professional groups, has presented at national and international conferences including a number of keynote addresses and he supervises doctoral research. He acts as an expert advisor to police and as an expert witness approximately 10 times per year in civil and criminal cases, particularly in the areas of trauma, bereavement and child testimony.
